Big Data Science and AI: In May 2023, the Bioethics Advisory Committee (BAC) published a consultation paper 'Ethical, Legal and Social Issues Arising from Big Data and Artificial Intelligence Use in Human Biomedical Research'. NCCS accepted the invitation from the BAC to comment on the paper and participate in the consultation.

The Council begins its paper by commending the BAC for a substantive and well-thought contribution to the ongoing discourse on the use of big data and artificial intelligence in human biomedical research. It then presents a theological framework informed by Scripture and tradition within which Christian reflections on these issues must be conducted. The paper then proceeds to discuss two fundamental principles from the Christian perspective, namely, human dignity and the common good, and their implications to big data science and the use of A.I. for human biomedical research.
