ICCS (International Conference on Cohesive Societies) 2025. President Tharman Shanmugaratnam gave the opening keynote speech. He said that multiculturalism needs more than mere co-existence. It needs to be sustained by shared hopes, a shared purpose and a shared endeavour. To this end, a culture of respect is a source of mutual uplifting. He urged delegates to respect each other in the active weaving of multicultural societies.

Some 1,100 delegates from 50 countries came for the three-day ICCS 2025 (24 - 26 June) at the Raffles City's Convention Centre on the theme, "Cohesive Societies, Resilient Futures". The Conference aims to convey the message that cohesive and resilient multicultural societies are key to promoting harmony. The programme comprises large group plenaries, practitioner-oriented breakout and sharing sessions and skill-based workshops. A two-day Young Leaders Programme for more than 200 young leaders under the age of 35 followed the main Conference. NCCS was represented at ICCS 2025 by Assoc Gen Sec Rev Dr Chiang Ming Shun.
