Fellowship of Evangelical Students (FES)

The Fellowship of Evangelical Students (FES) started in 1959 as the national coordinating body to promote Christian witness in the Institutes of Higher Learning (IHL) in Singapore. Today, FES has 24 Christian Fellowships (CF) across ten universities and four polytechnics. These CFs include both local and international students speaking the languages of English, Chinese, and Indonesian. FES is also part of the International Fellowship of Evangelical Students (IFES) which connects student movements from over 180 countries.

One unique aspect of the Christian Fellowships under FES is its emphasis on student leadership and student initiative. Each CF is led by its own student leaders who make strategic decisions, practice peer discipleship, and engages their campuses as faithful witnesses of Christ. This is because FES recognizes that students in the campus are most strategically placed to reach their own peers, not only while in school but also upon graduation. This belief and strategy give rise to the FES vision that is to see a community of Christlike leaders who are salt and light on campus, in the church, and in society for the glory of God.

To support students in their mission on campus, FES sends staff workers to the CFs to develop the students' faith through the study of Scripture, spiritual formation, training and equipping, and challenging them to integrate their faith with their life as students. FES also runs national events, such as the Leaders' Party and Graduation Party, to equip and build the community of student leaders and young graduates respectively. Through campus engagement initiatives and mission education programmes, FES also aims to cultivate wholistic missional perspectives both theologically and practically.
