King of Glory Church is a vibrant and growing congregation with a heart for people and a passion to serve. Rooted in the belief that God's love knows no boundaries, the church continues to reach out across communities in Singapore through various ministries that reflect compassion, hope, and faith in action.

Love and Comfort Ministry

The Love and Comfort Ministry reaches out to those in need — irrespective of race, language, or religion — embodying Christ's love through practical service. Working in partnership with the Jalan Besar Community Centre, the ministry provides assistance to underprivileged families, supports charitable causes, and organises free medical check-ups for the community.

This initiative is driven by church volunteers who give their time and energy to serve others. Through these efforts, many lives have been touched and hearts uplifted, as the ministry continues to be a bridge of care and encouragement to the needy.

Sembawang Ministry

Under the Love and Comfort arm, the Sembawang Ministry extends outreach to migrant workers in Singapore. Each Sunday evening, 60 to 100 individuals gather for a time of worship, fellowship, and community. Beyond spiritual support, the ministry provides opportunities for recreation, sharing meals, and building meaningful friendships.

What began as a simple outreach has grown into a close-knit community where people experience both the joy of belonging and the love of Christ in action.

Medical Camp

As part of ongoing community engagement, Love and Comfort Ministry also runs weekly Medical Camps to promote health awareness and provide basic check-ups such as blood pressure, blood sugar, height, and weight measurements. These sessions are conducted at both Bukit Batok (BBTK) and Norris locations, reaching between 20–30 participants weekly at BBTK and around 50–60 at Norris.

Beyond physical care, these gatherings also open doors for encouragement, conversation, and prayer — reminding all that caring for the body and soul go hand in hand.

Sunday Services

King of Glory Church holds six Sunday services weekly — four at the Norris location and two at Bukit Batok — with a combined congregation of about 1,000 worshippers. Each service is filled with heartfelt worship, the preaching of God's Word, and an atmosphere of

faith and fellowship.

These services continue to be a time of renewal and growth, drawing people from diverse backgrounds to encounter the transforming love of Christ.

Youth Ministry

The Youth Ministry at King of Glory Church is dedicated to raising a generation of young believers grounded in strong Christian values and empowered for worship and leadership. Youth Services are held weekly — on Saturdays at 4:00 pm at Norris and Sundays at 8:30 am at Bukit Batok.

The services combine dynamic worship, interactive discussions, games, and impactful sermons that speak to real-life challenges. The youth are encouraged to use their gifts in music, media, and service, becoming active contributors to the life of the church.

Through these gatherings, many young people are discovering their purpose and deepening their relationship with God.

King of Glory Church continues to move forward with the vision of being a light in the community — where love is shared, lives are strengthened, and God is glorified through every act of service.

SCOPE

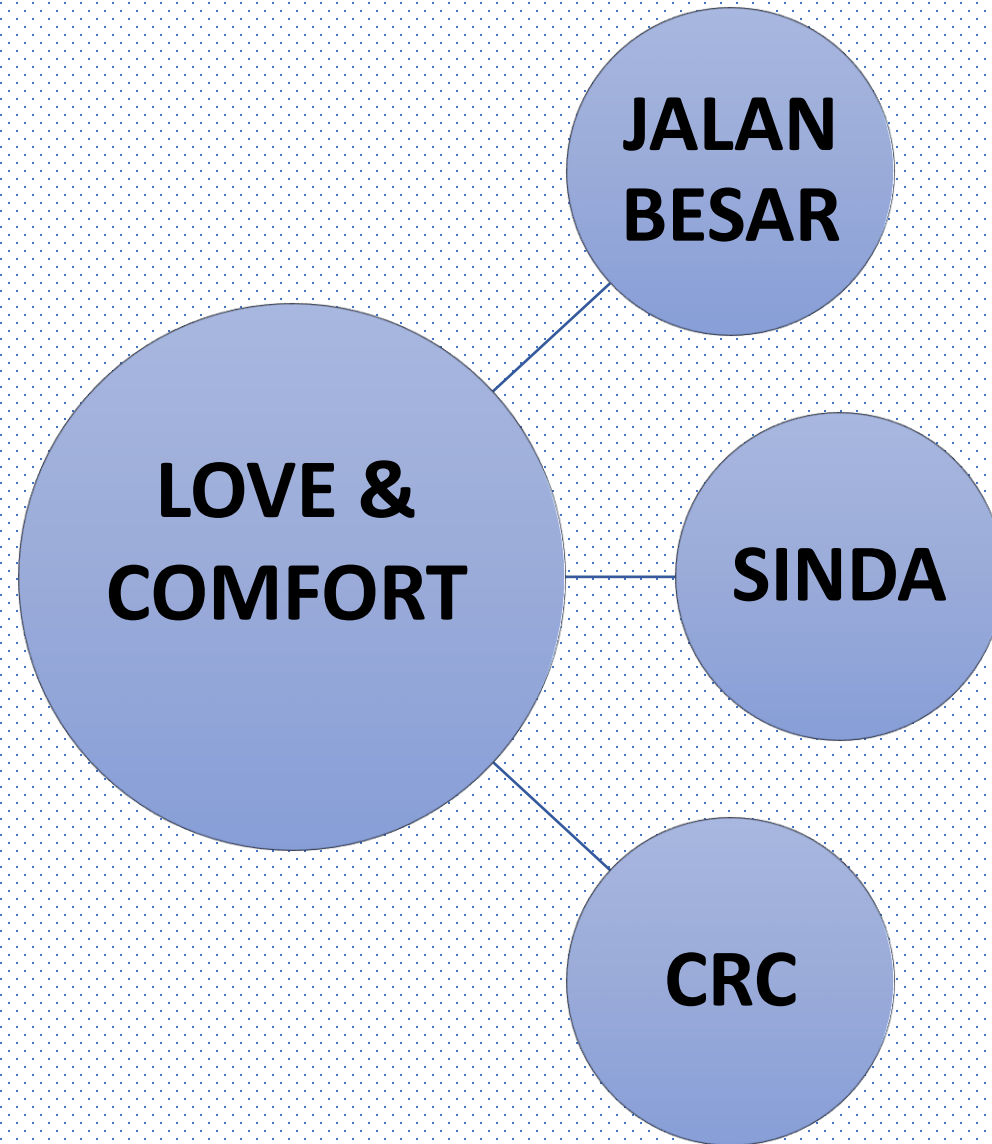

In addition to the above engagement activities we conduct Sunday evening worship services for the Guest Workers in dormitories who are unable to attend weekly worship services.



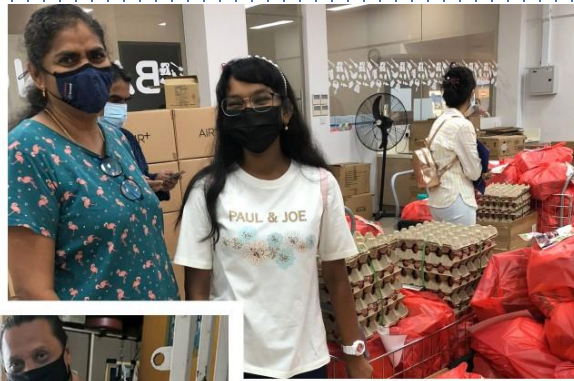
