

National Council of Churches of Singapore Statement on the Bondi Beach Shooting in Sydney

The National Council of Churches of Singapore (NCCS) expresses its profound shock and sadness over the tragic events that unfolded on 14 December 2025 at Bondi Beach, Sydney, where a Hanukkah festival was attacked, resulting in the loss of innocent lives and injuries to many others.

We condemn in the strongest terms all acts of anti-Semitism and any form of terrorism targeting communities based on their faith, ethnicity, or beliefs. Such acts are a grave violation of the sanctity of human life and contrary to the teachings of Christ, who calls us to love our neighbours as ourselves (Mark 12:31) and to pursue peace (Matthew 5:9).

In this time of sorrow, we appeal to Christians across Singapore to uphold the families of the victims and the Jewish community in Sydney and worldwide in prayer. May God's comfort and peace be upon those who grieve, and may His Spirit bring healing to the wounded and strength to those caring for them.

The Council also wishes to express our solidarity with the Jewish community in Singapore and globally, affirming that such hatred has no place in society. We stand together in condemning violence and in upholding the dignity, safety, and rights of all people.

May God grant wisdom, protection, and unity to all communities, and may His love prevail over hatred.
